

Setting The Scene



We will have a new name on the West Cup after tonight's Final as neither Giffnock North or Hurlford Thistle have won the competition in its 91 years history. This will be Hurlford's 2nd West Final appearance: they were the losing finalists last season, Giffnock North will be playing in the Final for the first time.

295 Clubs entered the West Cup this season and the Final is in effect Round 9. To get here you probably need a bit of luck coupled with a lot of skill and determination. Hurlford must have got their bit of luck in the first round when they got a bye but after that it is difficult to see how luck had much to do with their progression to the Final. They ran up scores of 13, 14 and 10 in the 2nd, 3rd and 4th Rounds before disposing of Whitefield Rovers 3-1 in the 5th, Then they faced Ayrshire rivals Clark Drive and came home with a 2-0 win. The quarter finals produced a nail biting clash with Colville Park. It went to extra time

and Hurlford got a late winner to take the tie 4-3. Their semi final at Airdrie had them two down to Bannockburn at the break but an amazing second half fightback brought Hurlford a 3-2 victory and

their place in tonight's final.

Giffnock North also got a bye in the 1st Round followed by an impressive 6-1 disposal of Glentyan in the 2nd. An away 3-1 win at Jordanhill gave them a home clash with Oban Saints in the 4th. This proved to be a tough one and it went to a penalty shoot out. A narrow 3-2 win over Eddlewood in the 5th gave them a home 6th

Round tie with St Mungo's. To the surprise of some, Giffnock were 5-1 winners but in the quarter finals their match with Eastfield went to extra time before North edged it 2-1. Their opponents in the semi final were the competition's surprise package Blochairn Star "B". The Blochairn youngsters fought well but Giffnock's experience carried the day, if only by a single goal margin.

Last season Giffnock were Caledonian League Champions and won the Challenge Cup. They may have slipped a bit this year but they are holding their own in a very competitive league and will be "up for it" tonight. Hurlford have continued their recent domination in Ayrshire and are well placed to sweep the board again this season. However, this is a big Cup Final and these matches are often determined more by luck, nerve and determination than by the form book!

The Association has selected four very experienced officials to maintain the best of order and we wish Steven Nicholls and his colleagues an enjoyable match. Good luck to both of our Finalists. We know your players and



management staff have worked hard to get here. We also know both clubs can't lift the Cup but we do hope you all leave Douglas Park feeling you have contributed to a top class game of football. Good luck, enjoy the match and may the best team win!

Giffnock To End 57 Year Wait?

The North were formed in 1943 and started in the now defunct East Renfrewshire League. 1950 saw the beginning of a long association with the Scottish Amateur League where the club competed with distinction until the formation of the Caledonian League in 1982. However the North's 3rd team continued to play in the SAFL until 2002.

The 2nd team played in the Greater Glasgow Premier League, winning their challenge cup three years running, 1992, 93 and 94. They also won the league cup in 1991. From 1950 through to 1982 the North had many highlights winning the SAFL's 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th Divisions. The 1st team also won the SAFL Coronation Cup on several occasions. However the pinnacle of success came in 1957 with the winning of the Scottish Amateur Cup.

Another remarkable achievement was winning every competition on offer in the SAFL. The North won the 1st Division, the Coronation Cup, the reserve division, the Hall Cup and the Ball Trophy!

In 1983 the North accepted an invitation to join the Caledonian League where they have competed ever since. In 1996/97 they won the 1st Division for the first time. The William Turner (Queen's Park) Challange Cup was won in 1986 and again in 2008. Last season saw the North have arguably their best season when they won both Caledonian Premier League and the Challenge Cup to give them their first ever double since joining the Caledonian.

Tonight's West of Scotland Cup Final is another major milestone in the club's history. They have waited 57 years since winning the Scottish Cup and a victory tonight would represent a huge addition to their trophy winning exploits over many years. It also gives the club, its players and officials an opportunity to say "thank you" to their supporters and sponsors. They go into the match well aware of Hurlford's record in recent years and they know they will need to be at their best to win. However, everyone at the North is looking forward to a great final which they hope will keep you well entertained until the final whistle.

Hurlford Chasing the West and the Scottish Cups

Located on the east side of Kilmarnock astride the River Irvine is the community of Hurlford. Despite its population figure of around 5000, it has a strong "village" identity and like most villages it has a strong community spirit. Football has always been important in Hurlford whether at youth, amateur or junior levels but never more so than now. Thistle's current success has been catching: their Junior neighbours Hurlford United are through to the Final of the Scottish Junior Cup.

Hurlford Thistle are one of Ayrshire's longest established clubs but for most of the club's history the notion of a major Cup Final appearance would have been looked on as a somewhat fanciful idea.

The club had to wait until the 2000's to make a real impact. They moved up through the lower divisions and in 2002 won promotion to the Premier Division.

In 2002/3 they finished a respectable 6th in the Premier and won the Walker and Templeton Trophy. In 2003/4 they retained the Walker and Templeton but more importantly they won the Premier League to establish themselves as one of Ayrshire's top clubs. A West Cup semi-final followed in 2004/5 when they made it three in a row in the Walker & Templeton and added the Donsport Trophy for good measure. Subsequent seasons brought more cup success. Hurlford won the Ayrshire Cup for the first time in 2010 and completed the 'Double' by winning the Premier League. They retained their league title in 2011 and 2012 and also won the L&M Survey Trophy in both seasons.

In 2009, the club went to Hampden for their first ever Scottish Cup Final and although they lost to Queen's Park it was a memorable day for everyone connected to the club. They were back in the Final in 2012 and lifted the Cup with a 2-0 win over Colville Park. They have now reached their 3rd Scottish Final and later this month will play Colville Park, hoping to repeat their 2012 success. The two clubs also clashed in last season's West Final but on that occasion the honours went to Colville They are currently on track for a 5th consecutive Ayrshire Premier championship and will be playing to retain the Ayrshire Cup later this month (an Ayrshire Cup win would be their 3rd on the trot)

Hurlford's record, particularly in the last 13 years, is outstanding. Managed by Hugh Houston and David Walker, two very experienced men in amateur and junior football, they play with an attacking style which has been both successful and entertaining. The squad has a good balance of experience and youth with some prolific goal scorers. They are supported by a very active set-up and will be well prepared for today's clash.

Hurlford will give Giffnock North the greatest of respect tonight but they will be determined to start a winning run here at Hamilton. We all hope it will be a great Final. Question is : can Giffnock derail the Thistle Express??
