








A WORD FROM THE VICE PRESIDENT

ABERDEENSHIRE AFA



The Aberdeenshire Amateur Football Association has a membership of 78 clubs and is currently one of the largest Amateur Football Associations in Scotland. The Association was formed in 1947 and its coverage extends to both the City of Aberdeen and Aberdeenshire. The Association is affiliated to the Scottish Amateur Football Association ("SAFA"), which celebrated it's Centenary in 2009, and the aims of the Association are to foster and develop the game of amateur football in the local area.

League Structure

The AAFA clubs are divided into six leagues – a Premier Division, two First Division sections (North and East), two Second Division sections (North and East) and a Third Division. The system of promotion and relegation allows new clubs to reach the Premier Division within three seasons.

The Champions in the respective leagues in season 2016-17 were as follows:

- Premier Division: Woodside
- · Division One (North): Cove Thistle
- · Division One (East): Cowie Thistle
- · Division Two (North): Newburgh Thistle
- · Division Two (East): Bridge of Don
- · Division Three: Faithlie United

A Player of the Year award is made to the outstanding player in each division, based on man of the match votes from opponents in league games throughout the season. A Divisional Fair Play trophy is also awarded to the team in each division with the fewest disciplinary points throughout the season.

Cup Competitions

All AAFA Clubs are eligible to enter the Scottish Amateur Cup competition. The first two rounds are drawn on a regional basis and there is a national draw from the third round onwards.

AAFA Clubs are also eligible to enter the North of Scotland Amateur Cup which is one of seven regional cup competitions run under the auspices of the Scotlish Amateur Football Association.

The AAFA also organises a range of cup competitions for member clubs each season. The most prestigious of these is the Aberdeen FC Trophy, which was donated to the Association by Aberdeen Football Club in season 1947-48. The Aberdeen FC Trophy is a knock-out cup competition for all Member Clubs. The two other main AAFA Cup Competitions are the Association Trophy (contested by clubs at Premier and First Division level) and the Dickie Trophy (contested by clubs at Second and Third Division level).

In addition, there is a knockout league cup competition for each division, as follows:

- Premier Division Premier Trophy
- · Division One (North) Stephen Shield
- · Division One (East) White Cup
- · Division Two (North) Castle Rovers Cup
- · Division Two (East) Barclay Cook Cup
- · Division Three Chattan Rovers Cup
- Bowie Trophy
- Edmond Trophy
- · Hans Fyfe Trophy

The Ian Napier Memorial Shield is contested annually by the Division One (North) and Division One (East) champions from the previous season. The John Todd Memorial Trophy was introduced in season 2009/10 and is contested by the top two clubs from the Premier Division in the previous season.

The Association was formed in 1998 with the amalgamation of the Lothian Amateur F.A. and the Edinburgh Amateur F.A. Both Associations of course have a longer history, the Lothian Amateur FA being founded in 1910 and the Edinburgh Amateur FA in 1920. Although originally a Saturday football Association, some 9 years ago the Association decided to branch out and start a Sunday Section which has gradually grown.

The Saturday Section has 5 divisions for the 2017/18 Season - Premier, Championship, Lothian West and Lothian East, and an Intermediate Division. The Sunday Section has 4 Divisions - Sunday Morning Division 1, Sunday Morning Division 2 and on Sunday afternoon, Premier Division and Division 1.

It is one of the largest Association in Scotland now and since the merger has been able to boast of having the Scotlish Amateur Cup winners, the East of Scotland Cup winners and South of Scotland Cup winners.

The Lothian & Edinburgh AFA upholds the objects of amateur football to promote, foster and develop the game of Association football by offering both new and established clubs and their players the platform to perform at a level which suits them.
