NORTH OF TAY AMATEUR CUP



The cup is the third oldest cup competition organised by the Scottish Amateur Football Association following the Scottish Amateur Cup (1909/10) and the West of Scotland Amateur Cup (1923/24)

The North of Tay Amateur Cup was presented by Mr R A Lambie of Queens Park FC in 1909 who was the first President of the Scottish Amateur Football Association a position he held until 1921. The cup, first played for in 1928/29, was originally known as the Midland Cup and was competed for by clubs in Angus, Perthshire and Fife. A Fife Cup was introduced in 1931/32 but Fife teams continued to enter the Midland Cup until the 1936/37 season when clubs were advised they could only enter one District Cup.

In season 1951/52 the cup name was changed to the North of Tay Amateur Cup.

The first ever competition was won by YM Anchorage at Dens Park Dundee in April 1929. Tonight's match is the 83rd final and YM Anchorage, the first winners went on to win on 10 occasions though sadly they went into abeyance in 1993.

Since the Millennium season Midlands AFA and Perthshire AFA clubs, have shared the cup on an almost equal basis. Both tonights finalist's are making their first appearance in the final. Riverside Athletic (MAFA) have most wins with 12 followed by YM Anchorage (MAFA) 10, NCR (MAFA) 7, Auchterhouse (MAFA) 5, Harris Academy FP MAFA) 5 and Fair City (PAFA) 4.
