A WORD FROM THE MATCH SECRETARY

There will be a new name on the West Cup after tonight's Final as neither Goldenhill nor Shortlees have won the Competition in it's 93 years history. Both Clubs will be making their first appearance in the Final, in what should be a fantastic spectacle of football.

302 Clubs entered this Season's West Cup and the Final is the 9th Round of the Competition. There will be an element of luck on the way to the Final, but judging by the Semi-Final performances of both Clubs, undoubtedly, a high level of skill and hard work to achieve the results which bring then to New Douglas Park, Hamilton tonight.

Goldenhill progressed to tonight's Final Following a 1st round bye, then wins at Lomond Vale and Kilbarchan Thistle, before defeating Carrick 6-4 after extra time, at home. An impressive 3-1 win away to Possil YM took them to the 6th Round and a 2-2 draw with Bannockburn before winning the penalty shootout 5-3. Similarly, a 3-3 draw in the Quarter Final against Hurlford Thistle was decided with again a 5-3 penalty shoot-out win. An excellent Semi-Final performance saw them win through 2-1 after extra time against Colville Park, having gone behind in the opening minutes of the match.

Shortlees also received a 1st Round bye before defeating Cambusnethan Talbot (SSMFL) and Mearns, followed up by a 2-0 win at home to Cumbernauld Colts. A comprehensive 9-2 win over East Kilbride Thistle and 4-0 win over Dalziel HSFP took them through to the Quarter Final against East Kilbride FC and an impressive 7-2 win set them up for a Semi-Final tie with Scottish Amateur Cup holders Harestanes. An excellent match was played out for the first hour or so but once the second Shortlees goal was scored it was difficult to see the Ayrshire side being denied a place in the Final and they ran out worthy 4-0 winners.

It would take a brave person to call the winner, but one thing is for certain, both teams fully deserve their place in tonight's Final.

The Association has selected James Gallacher to Referee tonight's Final and along with his three Assistants we wish them well for the match.

The Staff and Players of both Clubs have worked hard to reach this stage and we wish you all well and know that at the end of the evening there will be very different outcomes for you both, but hopefully an exceptional piece of skill will be the deciding factor.

Good luck, enjoy the match and may the best team win!

Goldenhill Amateur Football Club based in the Clydebank area may appear from the outset to be a relatively new team. Strictly speaking this is true, however after starting their SAFL journey in season 2012-13 at the bottom in Division 1 most of today's squad have continued their dedication to 'The Gowdie' following many successful seasons playing with Goldenhill Boys Club, formed over 40 years ago in 1971 from their strong roots in Faifley.

Unlike many fledgling teams Goldenhill made an instant impact on the amateur football scene. Three consecutive promotions have propelled the club into the Premier League and cup success was not slow to follow either. In their first season, 2012-13 The Coronation Cup was lifted after defeating East Kilbride. 2014-15 brought more silverware when they beat a fancied Finnart side to win The Centenary Cup. The team is now well-established and are serious title challengers for the Premier League this season.

Tonight's road to the final started in easy fashion with the team scoring 23 goals during the first three rounds. The fourth round provided more goals however Goldenhill were made to work hard for their 6-4 victory vs Carrick. The 5th round saw the team drawn away to Possil YM from the Fosters League, the boys came out eventual 1-3 winners. Tougher tests were sure to come and that was the case when a well organised Bannockburn team travelled to Clydebank. The teams played out a 2-2 draw. Goldenhill left it very, very late, equalising in stoppage time to take the game to extra time. A 5-3 penalty shoot-out win took the team into the QF where a strong Hurlford side lay in wait. This was another thrilling match, the game finished 3-3, more extra time and penalties followed. Gowdie advanced after another 5-3 shoot-out win. The semi-final brought a rematch of their Scottish Cup tie against an excellent Colville Park side. The lads were determined to make amends after that narrow loss, and yet again the game needed extra time to decide the winner. Goldenhill conceded an early goal but played possession football to get themselves back into the match. It ended 1-1 after 90 mins and the boys were determined not to take the game to penalties, Gowdie remained resolute and grabbed a deserved winner to qualify for tonight's final. Everyone associated with Goldenhill are thoroughly looking forward to tonight's great occasion and whilst we wish Shortlees all the best, the boys will be hoping they are singing along with their superb supporters 'Super Gowdie Ole!' at the end of the night.
